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Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Health and Wellbeing and Integrated Care Strategy Engagement

Purpose

 This report introduces Kit Connick, Chief Officer Partnerships and Strategy for the Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Integrated Care System (ICS), who will describe the approach being taken to developing the Health and Wellbeing and Integrated Care Strategy and seek views from the Healthwatch Board.

Key issues

- 2. Health and Wellbeing Boards are required by statute to have Health and Wellbeing three year strategies that set out how local health and care organisations will work together to improve the health and wellbeing of local people.
- 3. In Cambridgeshire and Peterborough it has been agreed that the two Health and Wellbeing Boards and the Integrated Care Partnership will have a single joint strategy with three shared health and wellbeing ambitions. These are:
 - Better outcomes for children
 - Reduce inequalities in deaths under 75
 - Increase the number of years in good health.

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- 4. These ambitions have been translated into four strategic priorities:
 - Create an environment to give people the opportunity to be as healthy as they can be
 - Ensure our children are ready to enter education and exit, prepared for the next phase of their lives
 - Promote early intervention and prevention measures to improve mental health and wellbeing
 - Reduce poverty through better employment and housing.
- 5. Colleagues from the Cambridgeshire and Peterborough ICS are seeking feedback and insights from partners and the public to inform the content of the strategy.
- 6. Public engagement materials are being drafted ready to launch this week.
