

<p>2.</p>	  	<p>What we have to say- independent members</p> <p>The Network Team's update on what they had been doing was sent to everyone before the meeting. They had been working with the Commissioners on the LD Vision.</p> <p>A big issue that they wanted to raise was that there were not many public toilets in Peterborough City Centre. ACTION: Graham to tell Karen Berkley (Peterborough City Council) as she is doing some work on this.</p> <p>The Speak Out Council update had also been sent to everyone. As well as working with Commissioners on the LD Vision, they had also been involved in the All-Age Autism Strategy.</p> <p>The Speak Out Council Day will be held on the 24th September.</p> <p>Dennis said that a number of bank branches had recently closed. He wanted to know what help is being given to people to help them access their benefits.</p> <p>Debbie felt that the two updates (Network Team and Speak Out Council) were not in Easy Read.</p> <p>Michelle said that there were spelling mistakes which made it difficult to understand.</p>

Siobhan said that schools and colleges have now restarted after the summer holidays.

Covid vaccinations are now being given to young people aged 12-16.

Flu vaccinations are now given to children from the age of 2.

Siobhan said that all the teams are now working as they had before the pandemic and that services are now running.

Gareth said that the Council's had read the report into Cawston Park Hospital, Norfolk, and it was a shocking report.

The hospital was a private hospital where some local authorities arranged for some people with Learning Disabilities to receive the support and care that they needed.

The Care Quality Commission looked at the hospital and said that it was inadequate. Because of the poor care that 3 people had been given, they had died. Cawston Park Hospital closed because of this.

The Council's and the Clinical Commissioning Group were working to make sure that they regularly check on anyone from Cambridgeshire or Peterborough who is supported in a hospital outside of the county.

Social Care teams are working with Commissioners for the winter plan and how they will increase contact with people and make sure that they get the support they need. They know that many people still feel isolated.

LD Vision

The Council's want to make sure that the services they provide will meet people's needs in the future.


Jason asked if the priorities were the same across Cambridgeshire and Peterborough. Maddy said yes but there may be some slight changes to what was most important in some of the areas.

Locality Networks

Carol Williams said that is from the Adults and Safeguarding Team at Cambridgeshire County Council.

The Locality Network meetings were only hold in Cambridgeshire. They brought together people with learning disabilities and/or autism, service providers and staff from the Learning Disability Partnership.

Carol said that there were a number of different ways in which people can get in involved in finding out about services and how to improve them.

- Healthwatch Health and Care Forum's (Fenland, Greater Cambridge, Huntingdonshire and Peterborough)
- East Cambridgeshire Community Hub
- Think Communities (Christian Swarbrick is coming to the LDPB in December to talk about this).

Gareth felt that it could be good for people to go to more community-based events so that people understood the needs of people with learning disabilities and/or autism better.

Debbie said that the Health and Care Forums do not do Easy Read versions of their agendas and minutes.

ACTION: Graham to feed this back to Healthwatch.

		<p>Debbie also said that the locality network meetings had social care staff at them. They were able to talk to people about problems they were having and would either get them the help they needed or tell them where they could get help.</p> <p>Debbie said that the Huntingdonshire Locality Network had been able to work with the Highways Authority to get a zebra crossing outside the Saxongate building in Huntingdon. Saxongate is a Papworth Trust building where people can go for different classes and day opportunities.</p> <p>ACTION: Gareth Peters to set up a Task and Finish meeting to talk about Locality Networks further.</p>
6.		<p>Update from other meetings</p> <p>Graham has been attending the Council’s adult social care forum. They have chosen three priorities:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Digital inclusion • Co-production • Transition from Children’s Services to Adult Services <p>The Council’s have written a plan on these priorities, showing what they are going to do and by when.</p> <p>The Healthwatch Health and Care Forums have been hearing about the Integrated Care Service - the new way that will manage the NHS in Cambridgeshire and Peterborough.</p>

<p>7.</p>		<p>Clinical Commissioning Group</p> <p>Amanda Duffin thanked everyone for inviting her to join the LDPB to represent the Clinical Commissioning Group.</p> <p>Amanda is the Head of Adult Learning Disability and Autism Commissioning and Contracting.</p> <p>Her team are responsible for:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Care and Treatment Reviews of people going into hospital. • CLASS (Communication, Learning and Autism Support Service). • Commissioning and Contracting services for health care • They are going to be recruiting a specialist Autism Liaison Nurse for hospitals. • They are looking at the annual health checks as they want to improve the quality of these for people. They are also looking at what stops people having the health checks so that they can remove these things that stop them. <p>Amanda introduced her colleague, Hannah Brookes.</p> <p>Hannah works on the Learning Disability Mortality Reviews - where the CCG looks into why people with learning disabilities have died. The CCG wants to learn about what happened and what could have been done differently.</p>
